Learning Objectives

Neonatal Quality at Hot Topics helps neonatal providers improve care to newborns and their families through the use of quality improvement (QI). This year's program begins with a keynote address exploring the intersection of QI and public health to impact population-level health outcomes. Two panel discussions follow, one focusing on innovative QI initiatives in the U.S., and the second examining efforts in resource-limited countries. A new session for this year's conference will review the top QI publications in neonatology so far this year before the afternoon breakouts. The interactive breakout sessions will focus on practical lessons: QI methods, safety culture and Level IV NICU QI. The entire day of learning will offer suggestions participants can immediately utilize in their own QI projects.

The faculty at Hot Topics in Neonatology® will review current levels of evidence and practice in the areas of neonatology and perinatology. The program will include talks and discussion on the newest research on the diagnosis, prevention and treatment of health problems in the neonate, as well as long-term follow-up for the NICU graduate. Hot Topics seeks to involve clinicians from around the globe in the debate around both existing and emerging therapies and neonatal science with the goal of providing clinicians with achievable practice change.
